Link exploration:

God sent his only Son Jesus into the world not to judge the world but to save it. The wrongs that people had committed would be forgiven as long as they believed in Jesus and were sorry.

In Frozen 2 Elsa, who is gueen of Arundel, can hear a voice coming from the Enchanted Forest. She and her sister Anna remember being told as children that their grandfather had set up a treaty with their neighbouring tribe and he had a dam put up in their homeland, the Enchanted Forest, as a gift. Elsa feels like the voice is calling her so she follows it to the Forest and while she is there, she is told that all is not what it seems and that she must discover the truth about the past. Elsa goes back to right the wrongs of her ancestors, so that everyone, in both The Enchanted Forest and Arundel, can all enjoy their futures.

Jesus was sent into this world to eventually die on the cross for our sins (wrong doings). This was the ultimate act of sacrifice, he gave his life so that we could be forgiven.
