#### **Our speaker: Professor Nicola Slee**

Born and raised in a remote corner of North Devon, this is still the landscape to which Nicola naturally reverts and is drawn. After 7 years of full-time study in Cambridge, she has worked in theological education in a variety of settings in London and Birmingham. From 1997 she has been at the Queen's Foundation in a variety of roles. From 2014 to 2023 she was Director of Research. In 2017, she was appointed Professor of Feminist Practical Theology in the Faculty of Religion and Theology at VU Amsterdam, Queen's partner university for doctoral degrees. She has now reduced her hours of work substantially, but remains a Professorial Research



Fellow, continuing to supervise some dozen doctoral students.

Nicola is both a poet and theologian and has published widely in the fields of spirituality, feminist theology and poetics. Her most recent collection of poems and prayers is *Abba Amma: Improvisations on the Lord's Prayer* (Canterbury Press, 2022).

#### The Purpose of the Gathering

In our time together, Nicola will be exploring with us the place that reading and writing poetry might play in our spiritual lives. She will share something of her own love of poetry and offer a selection of poems, including some of her own, that open up key spiritual themes. In discussion and reflection together, we may want to consider the role that poetry could play in the ministry of spiritual direction as well as the role it might play in our own lives.

This online Gathering is for anyone who is seeking to explore their spiritual awareness and deepen their faithfulness or experience in the life of prayer. It is also likely to be helpful for those who are involved in the work of accompanying and listening to others on their spiritual journeys, whether they regard this work as 'spiritual direction' or are called to a more informal ministry of walking alongside others.
