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Foreword from the Diocesan Director of Education (DDE)

On behalf of the Worcester Diocesan Board of Education (DBE), we are delighted to offer you and your school team the opportunities that are contained within this year's Training and Support Service Level Agreement (TSSLA). We have again updated and reshaped our offer to support the continued development of your church school, ensuring the flourishing of children and adults alike. We are delighted to work as your partners to realise your Christian vision within your unique and special contexts.

This document sets out the core services that are available to all church schools as well as details of the enhanced support that we are able to offer to those schools that take advantage of the TSSLA. This year, we are delighted, once again, to be able to expand our training programme. We are offering more courses than ever, including the introduction of our new eight-week Bible course which is designed to enhance our understanding of the Bible in order to support a variety of aspects within school leadership, including vision setting, theology of leadership, understanding our mission in the community and leading effective Collective Worship. Our full suite of SIAMS-related training courses will be on offer again, having been revised and updated to reflect the new SIAMS Framework September 2023 and our learning from the first year of inspection under this framework.

As part of this Service Level Agreement, we continue to offer support for school leaders' mental health and wellbeing. We recognise the pressures you face in leading your schools and the challenges of the ever-changing educational landscape, whilst trying to strike some kind of work life balance. This year we have added additional training for school leaders and governors on mental health strategies and an opportunity for a day of planning and reflection at Holland House, the Diocesan retreat house. We very much hope that this continued offer can provide much needed support to you and your wider leadership teams.

All schools that purchase this SLA have access to book 15 hours of bespoke onsite support. Please try to book these hours in good time and you may wish to consider grouping with other cluster or MAT schools with similar training priorities. This will enable you to share the use of your hours, thereby making them go even further.

Governance and monitoring continue to be a focus of our work and this year's training has been revised in light of the recent introduction of new guidance for maintained schools and academy trusts. Our additional *Enhanced Governance Support* SLA offers greater bespoke support for you in meeting the developments and challenges of governance. This support can be accessed through the 15 hours of bespoke support offered in this SLA or can continue to be purchased directly through the *Enhanced Governance Support* SLA.

Our training and support services are open to all who work as part of your school community – Early Career Teachers (ECTs), class teachers, aspiring leaders, senior leaders, headteachers, clergy, and governors. All are welcome!

We look forward to working with you and your wider teams in the coming year and thank you for your continued commitment to the children and young people in your school communities. Tim Reid

Meet the Diocesan Education Team



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Entitlement of all Schools and Academies

Core Services are available to <u>all</u> church schools and academies at no cost and irrespective of membership of the Training & Support Service Level Agreement (SLA).

Core services are designed to support all of our schools' and academies' deeply Christian character. The entitlement of all schools and academies includes:

- basic telephone or email advice and support as required, from 9am-4pm, Monday to Friday (please see page 2 for contact details)
- regular information and resources from The Education Team via electronic mailings and the diocesan website
- attendance at the termly headteachers' briefings
- attendance at the termly governors' and governance professionals' (clerks') briefings
- places at governor-specific training events listed in the Diocesan Training & Support SLA Training Schedule
- administration and support with foundation governor/trustee appointments
- a diocesan Keeping in Touch (KiT) meeting an annual meeting with a member of The Education Team to discuss your school's current context and priorities
- telephone or support advice pre and post SIAMS and Ofsted inspection
- conversation with SIAMS or Ofsted Inspectors during their visit
- attendance at SIAMS and Ofsted feedback by a member of The Education Team
- attendance and support through headteacher appointment processes (interview day, preparation meetings and materials)
- attendance at a 2 day training course for newly appointed headteachers
- attendance at a 1 day training course for Early Career Teachers (ECTs)
- attendance at a 1 day training course for net zero carbon awareness
- advice, training and resources from The Diocese of Worcester Youth Officer
- school organisation advice and support (academisation, change of age range, etc.)
- pastoral support
- chaplaincy advice and development with local clergy
- advice on issues related to church school property, site ownership and trust deed
- advice about school building issues
- access to the Church and School Partnership Award
- access to RE Subject Leader update meetings three times a year
- access to RE moderation sessions.

Service Charter

Those schools and academies within our Diocese are entitled to expect members of the Diocesan Education Team to:

- have a pastoral concern for the staff, governors and pupils of the school or academy
- provide professional and expert information, advice and assistance
- deliver the services listed, upon request, to a high standard
- respond promptly and courteously to requests for assistance
- act with discretion and confidentiality
- be responsive to individual schools and academies and their distinctive ethos
- act with integrity and in accordance with Christian beliefs and values
- promote at all times the Christian foundation and ethos of the school or academy
- deal promptly and courteously with any complaints regarding the level of service provided
- represent the interests of Church of England schools and academies with partner Local Authorities (LAs), the Department for Education (DfE), Standard Advisory Councils for RE (SACREs), Regional Director, (previously know as Regional Schools Commissioner), The Church of England Education Office and other appropriate bodies.

In return, schools and academies subscribing to the agreement are expected to:

- keep the Diocesan Education Team informed of any changes in relation to the service required
- keep the Diocesan Education Team informed of any developments at the school or academy
- be available, given adequate notice, for meetings and / or visits
- give adequate and appropriate notice when requesting or postponing visits, meetings, training, etc, where possible giving at least 24 hours notice for any cancellations
- pay invoices promptly.

Complaints

Any complaints should, in the first instance, be directed to the <u>Diocesan Director of Education</u>. The Diocesan Director of Education will arrange for another officer to investigate and respond. If the matter is not resolved at this stage, the issue will be referred to an appropriate member of the Diocesan Board of Education.

Charges

In addition to the entitlement of all schools and academies detailed on page 3, schools are invited to buy additional services through this SLA. SLA schools and academies are entitled to access:

- all training courses set out in the Training Events Booking Form for an **unlimited number of** members of staff and / or the Governing Body
- the opportunity for **up to two school leaders** to attend our **Headteachers' & Senior** Leaders' Conference.
- **15 hours of bespoke in-school support**, detailed on pages 12-13.
- **Mental Health and Wellbeing Support for school leaders,** detailed on pages 7-11. These are in addition to the 15 hours of bespoke in-school support.

SLA charges for primary, first and middle, schools and academies:

- for schools with up to 249 pupils: £6.00 per pupil
- for schools with 250-349 pupils: charged as above up to 249 pupils, plus £5.00 for each additional pupil
- for schools with 350 pupils or more: charged as above up to 349 pupils, plus £4.00 per additional pupil.

All charges per pupil remain unchanged from the previous Training & Support SLA.

There is an expectation that all schools within multi-academy trusts will purchase the Training &

Support SLA.

Please note, all pupil numbers are based on those returned in the October 2023 School Census.

Church and School Partnership Award



The Diocesan Board of Education encourages all 100 schools to regularly assess the joint work undertaken with the local church. The Church and School Partnership Award is a new award in our diocese. It is one way of recognising the exceptional work that churches and schools do together.

Part of the SIAMS Framework looks at the relationship that schools have with a range of stakeholders, including the local church. This award does not seek to replace SIAMS but may give schools valuable evidence in how they live out their vision within the local community. This scheme looks to encourage both school and church to forge and maintain positive relationships and look at the ways in which they can flourish through becoming one community.

Application for the award is open to all schools and churches as part of the core entitlement for schools and academies. Who is Val Turner?

I was a teacher from 1972 to 1999 - with a few years in the 70's when I stayed at home to look after my babies. In 2000 I was ordained and I think it was in 2002 that Gloucester Education Department asked me to lead a headteachers' retreat day. Since then I have worked with teachers and school leaders providing pastoral support and guidance, sometimes one-to-one, but also for groups as retreat days, INSET training, and teaching on the spiritual leadership of a school community.

When I was a vicar I experienced the heavy weight of the relentless responsibility of being a leader - as a teacher, school governor and chaplain for RFDC (FE College), I came face-to-face with the challenges you engage with on a daily basis and I have immense respect and deep compassion for every one of you.

Since 2012 when I retired from parish ministry, I have opened my home to give pastoral support and spiritual direction. Most of my teaching was in the art department so I often offer art in various guises because it is so powerfully therapeutic. In addition to ordination training and spiritual direction, I trained as a school counsellor and chaplain.

• Collective Worship Review

The aim of this review is to support the school in making a judgement about the effectiveness of Collective Worship and provision for spiritual development. Areas that will be considered include:

- o creativity in the content and leading of worship
- o opportunities for prayer
- o children as leaders of worship
- o support for worship from the local church

Where the school have a CREW or Collective Worship committee, a meeting with these children is useful to consider their role and its impact. By the end of the day a number of practical 'next steps' will have been established to enable the school to move forward.

• Spirituality Review

The aim of this review is to support the school with spirituality around the school including the curriculum. Areas that will be considered include:

- o the school's understanding of spirituality
- o evidence of spirituality across the curriculum
- o evidence of spirituality around the school
- o monitoring of spiritual development
- o a contextualised and coherent understanding of spiritual development across the school.

By the end of the day a number of practical 'next steps' will have been established to enable the school to move forward.

• **RE Subject Audit**

During this audit, meetings will be held with the RE Lead, Link Governor and pupils to discuss:

- o the profile of RE in both school and the community
- o implementation of the Agreed Syllabus
- o monitoring of teaching, learning and progress
- o the assessment of RE
- o how the governors monitor the effectiveness of RE
- o how pupils express, develop and understand religious and non-religious concepts

By the end of the day a number of practical 'next steps' will have been established to enable the school to move forward. The day will also include a learning walk and book scrutiny.

Website Check

All schools are legally required to publish certain information on their website. Through the Level I website check, we look to see if schools and academies have published online what is legally required. We then provide each school with a checklist identifying documents and information they have and those they need to provide to be compliant with DfE regulations.

The Level 2 website check encompasses the tasks carried out in the Level 1 check and we also look at the detail within the required documents and policies to ensure they are in date and the content meets statutory requirements. As well as providing a checklist to each school, a member of our team will also feedback to the headteacher or relevant member of staff by telephone or Teams meeting.

• Statutory Policy Audit

This audit supports schools in ensuring they have all statutory policies in place. Our audit uses the requirements outlined in the DfE's 'Maintained or Academy Trust Governance' guidance; however, our audit makes it simple to see which policies and documents apply specifically to your school. The audit outlines the list of the statutory policies and documents you must keep, who should sign them off, and when they must be reviewed. We will RAG rate your document to highlight any necessary action required. We can also provide templates for statutory policies and documents within the DfE guidance. They can then be adapted to suit your school's needs, Christian vision and values, and are compliant with the necessary statutory guidance.

Analyse School Performance (ASP)

This will help staff and governors to increase both their familiarity with Analyse School Performance and their ability to analyse statutory school data using the Inspection Data Summary Report (IDSR) and the School Performance Summary Report.

The Bible Course

The Bible can often seem like a confusing book, with many stories, thoughts and events which at times can appear to be unrelated. Understanding the big story of the Bible can support how we understand a variety of aspects within school leadership, including setting vision, theology of leadership, understanding our mission in the community and leading effective Collective Worship.

The Bible Course is an eight session course, originally written for use in churches, that explores what the Bible is, what story it tells, and how that relates to your work in a school. This course is intended to support you in your understanding of the Bible and how to apply the better knowledge and understanding you gain from the eight sessions to your work in schools.

Every session will have a link to the 2 of the 24 leadership practices as highlighted in the Church of England's 'Called, Connected, Committed' documentation. As well as reflections which relate the learning to the SIAMS Framework and/or the Understanding Christianity RE resources.

But what exactly is courageous advocacy and how can we promote it in our schools?

This course will look at what courageous advocacy is and is not in our schools. We will also explore how SIAMS will inspect for courageous advocacy and look at some supporting resources. This session aims to:

- understand how children can become courageous advocates
- look at some key resources for courageous advocacy including Christian Aid's *Global neighbours* scheme and the Archbishops' Young Leaders Award.







Valuing All God's Children provides guidance to church schools on preventing and addressing homophobic, biphobic and transphobic bullying. Delegates will consider how schools may support young people who are exploring, or questioning their gender identity and sexuality. Delegates will also reflect on the inclusivity of their school's policies and practice through the lens of the Equality Act 2010 and the SIAMS Framework.

In the Mental Health and Wellbeing section, delegates will consider strategies that can be used to audit wellbeing across the school community.



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Walking directions from 'Lowesmoor'

Route I

Enter the Lowesmoor Wharf site and head to the left-hand side of the units directly opposite the entrance (including Worcester Foodbank). Follow the road with the units on your right and the housing on your left. Take the right-hand curve in the road as you reach the entrance to Worcester Marina and follow the road to the end.

The Diocesan Board of Finance (DBF) offices should be directly in front of you. The front door can be accessed down a couple of steps. Please ring the intercom on arrival; a member of the team will come to greet you.

Route 2

Enter the Lowesmoor Wharf site and head to the right-hand side of the units directly opposite the entrance (including Worcester Foodbank). Follow the road with the unit wall on your left and the 'Canal-side offices' on your right.

As you reach a building directly in front of you, head to its left and walk through the pedestrian gap in the low wall. The DBF offices should be directly in front of you. Head to the left of the building to access the front door which is located down a couple of steps. Please ring the intercom on arrival; a member of the team will come to greet you.
